It Takes a Village to Raise a Pastor

This morning, I woke up thinking about all the people who over the years have impacted my life and led me to where I am today. Honestly, there are far, yes way far too many to name. But there were some that were pivotal. I hope you will bear with me as I mention a few of them. The first was my Sunday School teacher when I was thirteen. His name was Mr. Overton. Mr. Overton not only taught us but spoke with us, listened to us, and even had us over for hot dogs. You must realize that my father had just died, we had just moved, and he was an adult presence that I sorely needed. Later, when I was a senior in high school, I began attending church again because he was the Senior High Sunday School teacher. He was also the deacon who knocked on my door one night and asked me to preach for youth Sunday, my first sermon. That changed everything. There was a fellow classmate, David Hylton, who may even join us on May 26th. David kept inviting me to these crazy Jesus freak, charismatic meetings that I finally agreed to attend. Another classmate was Billy Cox. When I preached my first sermon, Bill was there encouraging and supporting me. He was always there for all the big events in my life; always there to tell me, "You can do this." He was in my wedding. He drove from Virginia to Massachusetts to attend my graduation from Seminary. He was present three years later when I was ordained. In high school, he and I would sometimes drive around in the car singing praise songs together. We sounded terrible, but not to God. Bill died in an automobile accident when I was thirty. I have never gotten over it. The one I mention next may seem inappropriate, but I would not be honest if she had not been pivotal. That was my x-wife, Dail. She was brilliant, a masterful pianist, and a great writer. She worked crummy jobs to get me through seminary. She typed all the papers I wrote and was my chief editor. Remember this was the caveman days before computers. I could never have done this without her. And of course, Sam. I belonged to a prayer group with a number of pastors when we were discussing the challenges the spouses of pastor's face.

Two of the pastors spoke up and said, "IT'S SO MUCH HARDER TO BE A PASTOR'S SPOUSE THAN IT IS TO BE A PASTOR!" Both had been pastor's wives before becoming pastors. I believe that to be true. Many hours here meant I was gone a lot. She never complained but always encouraged me and became a partner in my ministry. She was the one who grounded me, comforted me, and helped me to see things from a different perspective. The main thing she did these past twenty years was keep me laughing. You may not know this, but we were married only a week when we moved here. I recently found a card in my desk from her, celebrating our one-month anniversary. I could never have done this without her.

Then there was you. I have never pastored a church so hospitable, so loving, so affirming. I never served a church where members sent me cards telling me how much they appreciated me, or how much they liked last week's sermon. NEVER! We have never gone through a holiday when someone in the church has not asked us over since we had no family here. I cannot tell you how many holidays before coming here, I have spent alone. I have loved being a pastor. Even more I have loved being your pastor. I have had the most gifted staff, lay leaders, and musicians who made me look so good. I am so appreciative of all the people who helped me to get where I am today, but most of all, I have appreciated the opportunity of serving you these past 20 years.




OUR SPRING BIBLE STUDY 2024



Do you know ALICE?

ALICE is our friend, neighbor, coworker, and family member.

ALICE cares for our children and aging parents, fixes our cars and works in our local grocery stores, retail stores and restaurants.

ALICE is sitting in our pews and volunteering in church activities.

ALICE: Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed

In Connecticut, more than 550,000 households are ALICE, with income above the Federal Poverty Level but below the state's basic cost-of-living threshold as defined in the 2023 ALICE Report.

ALICE workers are retail workers, nursing assistants, childcare workers, home health aides, maintenance workers, teacher assistants – *workers essential to us and our community.* ALICE households are one emergency away from a financial crisis impacting their ability to feed their families, heat their homes, maintain their housing, and ensure their medical care. Some of our ALICE neighbors are experiencing homelessness despite working full time plus.

Demographics about Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed

- 60% of CT's most common job occupations pay below \$20/hour
- In Stratford, 45% of people are ALICE (21,187 households)
- The youngest of us (under age 25) and oldest (age 65+) households face the highest rates of hardship

Why do so many feel they are working hard and getting behind? Look at the Household Survival Budget guidelines

- 1 adult with 1 child = \$65,244 annually (hourly wage of \$32.62)
- 2 adults with 2 children = \$127,812 annually (combined hourly wage of \$63.91)
- Senior citizen couple = \$68,292 annually

What do we do? We first need to become knowledgeable. What is changing +/-? What could make a difference? Who should get tax credits? Do we invest in childcare subsidies? Which businesses do we support? Is education the answer? There are many questions to ponder in our hearts and minds. What actions are needed? Voting is one way to participate.

autism speaks world autism month

Every April Autism Speaks celebrates <u>World Autism Month</u>, beginning with the United Nations-sanctioned World Autism Awareness Day on April 2. This year marks the 17th annual World Autism Awareness Day.

Autism, or autism spectrum disorder (ASD), refers to a broad range of conditions characterized by challenges with social skills, repetitive behaviors, speech and nonverbal communication. According to the Centers for Disease Control, autism affects an estimated 1 in 36 children in the United States today.

We know that there is not one autism but many subtypes, most influenced by acombination of genetic and environmental factors. Because autism is a spectrum disorder, each person with autism has a distinct set of strengths and challenges. The ways in which people with autism learn, think and problem-solve can range from highly skilled to severely challenged. Some people with ASD may require significant support in their daily lives, while others may need less support and, in some cases, live entirely independently.

Several factors may influence the development of autism, and it is often accompanied by sensory sensitivities and medical issues such as gastrointestinal (GI) disorders, seizures or sleep disorders, as well as mental health challenges such as anxiety, depression and attention issues.

<u>Signs of autism</u> usually appear by age 2 or 3. Some associated development delays can appear even earlier, and often, it can be diagnosed as early as 18 months. Research shows that early intervention leads to positive outcomes later in life for people with autism. If you have concerns about your child's development, early intervention is important. Learning the signs, examining your child's developmental milestones, and getting an evaluation and treatment as early as possible can make a lifetime of difference.

- First Congregational Church Scholarships The following scholarships are available to students pursuing an undergraduate degree, who are members of First Congregational Church as of Jan. 1st of the current year. Students may apply more than once as they continue to be enrolled in a full-time undergraduate program, but <u>priority will be given to</u> <u>graduating high school seniors.</u>
 - The Frances C. and Harriet B. Blakeman Memorial Scholarship of \$5,000 given by the Board of Trustees. This is in recognition of their devotion and generosity to First Congregational Church.
 - The Jim and Ella Cebik Memorial Scholarship of \$1,000 is funded by a grant from their son, the late Roy Cebik.
 - The John Miller Edward Zorn Memorial Scholarship of \$1,000 if funded by a grant from his father, the late Bob Zorn.

(The criteria for judging the above three scholarships will be scholastic achievement, church and community activity involvement, leadership qualities and achievement potential.)

Gift Card Year-Round Fundraiser

For the past few years, FCC Stratford has participated in an important fundraising program that allows participants to donate money to the church just by purchasing gift cards through the church. There are more than 400 retailers available in the program through RaiseRight. These include grocery stores, home improvement stores as well as some of your online favorites like Amazon. FCC Stratford buys the gift cards at a discount and sells them to you at face value. The church receives the difference as a commission for directing spending in this way.

We want to grow participation in this program because it's an easy way to raise significant amounts of money for the church simply by harnessing the spending and gift giving habits of our congregation, friends, and families.

There are two ways to help:

(1) Don Coulson and Amy Elias are available in Upper Packard Hall most Sundays after church. They keep a limited number of regularly used gift cards on hand with retailers like Shop Rite, Stop and Shop, Big Y, Walmart, Amazon, and Home Depot for same day purchase for use.



There is also an extensive list of almost any retailer you can think of that you can purchase for physical delivery the following week. Many congregants use this program to buy gifts for loved ones and friends. Simply bring a check made out to FCC Stratford or bring cash.
